

## Sturt's Tree Walk



3 h 30 min to 4 h 30 min









This circuit walk in Sturt National Park takes you across the dry lakebed of Lake Pinaroo to the site of a tree, marked by Captain Charles Sturt in 1844 when he led the Central Australia Expedition to find the sea from Adelaide to the heart of Australia where he believed the sea lay. Let us begin by acknowledging the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.





Class 5 of 6 Rough unclear track	
Quality of track	Rough unclear track (5/6)
Gradient	Gentle hills with occasional steps (2/6)
Signage	Minimal directional signs (4/6)
Infrastructure	Limited facilities (such as cliffs not fenced, significant creeks not bridged) (4/6)
Experience Required	Some bushwalking experience recommended (3/6)
Weather	Foretasted & unexpected storms and severe weather may impact on navigation and safety (4/6)



Getting to the start: From Silver City Highway, B79

- Turn on to Cameron Corner Road then drive for 12.1 km
- Turn left onto Gum Vale to Hewart Downs Road, UR47 and drive for another 59.2 km
- Turn right onto Waka Road, UR05 and drive for another 42.8 km
- Turn left and drive for another 990 m
- Continue onto Cameron Corner Road and drive for another 28.7 km
- Turn right onto Fort Grey Camping Area Trail and drive for another 970 m

## Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning
- Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills & knowledge to undertake this journey safely
- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures & fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies & call for help at any point
- Are healthy and fit enough for this journey

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.
