



Dobroyd Head Walk (Guringai Country)











Walking around Dobroyd Head is a fantastic experience. The heath vegetation high up on the walk provides many opportunities to view flowers and insects close up, whilst still enjoying plenty of views out to the sea. Reef Beach is a great place to stop for a snack or lunch and to get the feet wet before heading back to the road. Let us begin by acknowledging the Guringai people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.





Class 4 of 6 Rough track, where fallen trees and other obstacles are likely	
Quality of track	Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles (3/6)
Gradient	Very steep (4/6)
Signage	Directional signs along the way (3/6)
Infrastructure	Limited facilities, not all cliffs are fenced (3/6)
Experience Required	No experience required (1/6)
Weather	Weather generally has little impact on safety (1/6)

Getting to the start: From Warringah Freeway, M1


- Turn on to Military Road Offramp, A8 then drive for 6.9 km
- Turn right onto Sydney Road and drive for another 275 m
- Turn right and drive for another 60 m
- Turn left onto Audrey Street and drive for another 205 m
- Turn right onto Wanganella Street and drive for another 215 m
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Wanganella Street and drive for another 280 m
- Turn left onto New Street West and drive for another 65 m Turn right onto Beatrice Street and drive for another 410 m
- Turn left onto Ernest Street and drive for another 460 m
- Turn right onto Curban Street and drive for another 185 m
- Turn right onto Vista Avenue and drive for another 85 m
- Turn left onto Dobroyd Road and drive for another 360 m
- Turn left onto Heathcliff Crescent and drive for another 55 m
- Turn right onto Elevation Avenue and drive for another 110 m
- Turn right onto Fisher Street and drive for another 90 m
- Turn sharp left onto Dobroyd Scenic Drive and drive for another 165 m


Before you start any journey ensure you;


- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.











Getting started: From the intersection, this walk follows the 'Manly' and 'The Spit' sign down the hill. The track winds down through bush which quickly becomes heath. The heath becomes short and thins out on the left, before the walk comes to an intersection, with a sign pointing back to 'Arabanoo Lookout'.

From the intersection, this walk follows the 'Manly' sign down the hill. The track winds slightly as it heads down the spur, with low heath and views of Manly most of the way down, coming to a clear rock shelf. The walk then continues with thick green heath on the right and less dense heath on the left, before coming to the signposted intersection.

From the intersection, this walk follows the 'Manly via Reef Beach' sign down the hill to a fenced lookout. From the lookout. the track heads further along the hillside to wind down past some more views. The track soon passes by a large rock shelf, as it comes close to the water and then comes to a boardwalk with bench seat behind Reef Beach.








Then head down the steps (about 7 m long)





After another 45 m head down the steps (about 145 m lona)












After another 170 m head down the steps (about 210 m long)








Reef Beach is a strip of sand facing north-east, towards the Manly Ferry Terminal in North Harbour. The beach is in Sydney Harbour National Park and has toilet facilities about 80m behind the beach. The beach was once a nudist beach, but clothing is no longer optional. The beach is fairly well protected from surf and provides a great place to rest and enjoy the views when walking around Dobroyd Head.








After another 65 m head down the steps (about 35 m long)





After another 155 m turn left.





After another 270 m **turn right**.



Then head up the steps (about 145 m long)



After another 45 m head up the steps



After another 7 m come to the end.
