

## 2 h 45 min to 4 h 30 min







This walk, from Blackheath Train Station, is a fantastic way to see some of the iconic areas of the Blue Mountains in the Blackheath area. The walk heads through Pope's Glen to Govetts Leap via a wonderful stroll along the creek, before breaking out to the views of the Grose Valley. The stunning views over the valley, waterfalls and bush make this a great walk with public transport access. Let us begin by acknowledging the Dharug & Gundungurra people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

**Getting started:** From the top of the station steps, this walk heads towards the Great Western Highway and Gardners Inn. The walk turns right down a flight of stairs. then turns left across the Great Western Highway at the pedestrian crossing. From the intersection, this walk heads up the Great Western Highway, keeping the Gardners Inn to the right. This walk turns right after the petrol station, turning onto Gardiners Cres. The walk continues down Gardiners Cres to take the first left onto Inconstant St. The walk then takes the first right onto Wills St. which later becomes Robertson Lane, Robertson Lane tends right into Gipps Lane, which is followed to the intersection with Dell St/Wills St (unsignposted, road changes name near this intersection).

From the intersection, this walk heads up the road, leaving Gipps St behind on the left and passing a wooden house (also on the left). The walk passes Cleopatra St on the left before coming to the signposted intersection with the Pope's Glen track on the right, near 49 Dell St.









Continue straight.





After another 20 m (Laws Lookout) turn right.



- After another 55 m come to the "Laws Lookout".
- After another 65 m cross the bridge (about 4 m lona)



After another 40 m turn right.



After another 8 m veer right.







After another 9 m **continue straight**.

After another 6 m pass the sign (on your right).

- After another 15 m pass the water tap (7 m on E C your right).
- Then come to the "Govetts Leap Lookout" (9 m 6 on your left).

Then pass the sign.

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After another 8 m find the "Govetts Leap **•** Lookout" (6 m on your right).



Govetts Leap Lookout is named after the first European man to have enjoyed this view, William Govett, as an assistant surveyor in June 1831. Govetts Leap Lookout offers wonderful views over the Grose Valley and the spectacular Bridal Falls. The word `leap` is an old Scottish word meaning waterfall. The lookout is easily accessed from the car park, there are also toilets and picnic shelters nearby.

After another 245 m pass a seat (5 m on your riaht).

After another 1 m **continue straight**.

After another 15 m head down the earthen steps (about 370 m long)



Then pass a seat (5 m on your right)., has no backrest.

After another 180 m pass the "Bridal Veil Falls" (30 m on your left).



After another 10 m cross the stepping stones.

Start of an optional side trip: An optional side trip to Barrow Lookout.



To start this optional side trip turn left here. Start.

Then head down the earthen steps (about 75 m long)



Barrow Lookout. Blue Mountains National Park. looks down to Govetts Leap falls and across the Grose Valley. The lookout is fenced and has a bench seat to rest.

A seat., has a backrest.



Turn around and retrace your steps back the 85 m to the main route.



Back at the main route veer left and follow on from the 4.8 km waypoint.



After another 4 m turn right.

After another 570 m continue straight.

After another 690 m find the "Braeside Picnic Area" (10 m on your left).



Braeside Picnic Area, Blue Mountains National Park, is a small picnic area on the southern end of the Braeside walking track. The picnic area has a bench table and stone barbeque. The picnic area is situated next to a small weir and waterfall amongst the ferns.





After another 20 m **continue** 





After another 70 m turn right.



After another 215 m **turn left**.



After another 100 m continue straight.



After another 125 m **turn right**.

After another 30 m **turn left**.

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After another 115 m continue





After another 150 m continue

After another 30 m pass the "Jubilee Park" (15 m on your left).



After another 85 m turn right.



After another 55 m continue straight.

After another 85 m turn left.



After another 135 m **turn right**.

After another 215 m pass the "Blackheath Bar & Bistro" (15 m on your left). W:https



Then pass the water tap (9 m on your left).



After another 20 m pass a seat (6 m on your left).
