## Daphne Place Dog Walking Trail



This is a pleasant dog-friendly walk, passing through some nice bush on the fringe of Cherrybrook. Despite being within the Berowra Valley Regional Park, this is an 'Authorised On-Lead Dog Walking Track'. The walk starts at the end of Daphne PI, Cherrybrook and can be done as a one-way walk, finishing at Patricia Cl , or by returning along the same track. Let us begin by acknowledging the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles

| Quality of track | Clear and well formed track or trail (2/6) |

| Gradient | Short steep hills (3/6) |
| Signage | Directional signs along the way (3/6) |
| Infrastructure | Limited facilities, not all cliffs are fenced (3/6) |
| Experience Required | Some bushwalking experience recommended (3/6) |
| Weather | Weather generally has little impact on safety (1/6) |

Getting to the start: From New Line Road

- Turn on to Shepherds Drive then drive for 530 m
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Shepherds Drive and drive for another 305 m
- At roundabout, take exit 1 onto Shepherds Drive and drive for another 520 m
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Shepherds Drive and drive for another 480 m
- Turn right onto Appletree Drive and drive for another 520 m
- Turn left onto Blackwattle Trail and drive for another 120 m
- Turn left onto Daphne Trail and drive for another 500 m


## Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning
- Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills \& knowledge to undertake this journey safely
- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures \& fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies \& call for help at any point
- Are healthy and fit enough for this journey

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.

Getting started: From the very end of Daphne Place, the walk follows the bush track from the grassy nature strip, keeping all the houses (and the 'Tuscan Way' signpost) to the left, and immediately bends to the right and passes a signposted gate above a drainage culvert. The walk follows an arc to the left for some distance before going gently uphill, then bending to the right behind the houses, keeping the houses on the left. The track then becomes asphalted and goes more steeply up the hill, bending to the right before passing a gate and coming out opposite 5 Patricia Place.


After another 340 m turn right
