


Kalamina Gorge

Rough track, where fallen trees and other obstacles are likely


Hough truck, where funct trees and other obstacles are intery	
Quality of track	Rough track, where fallen trees and other obstacles are likely (4/6)
Gradient	Short steep hills (3/6)
Signage	Directional signs along the way (3/6)
Infrastructure	Limited facilities (such as cliffs not fenced, significant creeks not bridged) (4/6)
Experience Required	Moderate level of bushwalking experience recommended (4/6)
Weather	Foretasted & unexpected storms and severe weather may impact on navigation and safety (4/6)


Getting to the start: From Great Northern Highway, 95

- Turn on to Karijini Drive then drive for 29.4 km
- Turn right onto Banjima Drive and drive for another 9.9 km
- Continue onto Banjima Road and drive for another 17.3 km
- Turn right onto Kalamina Road and drive for another 5.8 \mbox{km}
- Keep right onto Kalamina Road and drive for another 115 \mbox{m}




Getting started: From the car park at the end of Kalamina Road, Karijini National Park, head along the dirt trail, passing a sheltered seating area with informative signs (to your right). Follow the dirt trail ahead for about 75 metres, descending a few stone steps. After passing a 'Cliff Risk Area' sign, turn right and head down a series of rocky steps to reach the bottom of the gorge. After reaching the gorge floor, turn right and follow the path ahead for about 50 metres to check out Kalamina Falls. After visiting the falls, turn around and head back towards the entry steps, then proceed straight ahead further into the gorge to continue the Kalamina Gorge hike.




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Start of an optional side trip: This little side trip takes you to Kalamina Falls.



After another 45 m come to "Kalamina Falls". Kalamina Falls is a tiny seasonal waterfall sitting at the head of the Kalamina Gorge in Karijini National Park. Although it's a small waterfall, the charming beauty of it makes up for its size. It only takes a brief 5-minute walk from the car park to reach the falls.





Continue another 800 m to find the end. Then turn around here and retrace the main route for 930 m to get back to the start.
