


Return

Easy track

Getting to the start: From Summerland Way, B91

- Turn on to Gradys Creek Road then drive for 11.2 km
- Turn right onto Simes Road and drive for another 3.2 km
- Turn sharp left onto Forest Road and drive for another 10.8 km
- Keep right onto Tweed Range Scenic Drive and drive for another 4.2 km
- Turn right onto Tweed Range Scenic Drive and drive for another 4.3 km

- · Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills & knowledge to undertake this journey safely
