

## Ben Hall's Cave Walking Track (Wiradjuri Country)



20 min to 30 min








Starting from Ben Hall's parking and picnic area this circuit walk takes you through low open forest to a cave, used as a shelter by the infamous bushranger, Ben Hall. Enjoy the views from the cave lookout before heading back for a picnic. Let us begin by acknowledging the Wiradjuri people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Getting to the start: From Mid Western Highway, B64


- Turn on to Lynchs Road then drive for 4.3 km
- Turn right onto Back Piney Range Road and drive for another 6.4 km
- Turn left and drive for another 2.7 km
- Turn left and drive for another 280 m
- Turn right and drive for another 240 m


## Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning
- · Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills & knowledge to undertake this journey safely
- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures & fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies & call for help at any point
- · Are healthy and fit enough for this journey

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.









Start




After 30 m pass the car park (25 m on your left).



Then pass the toilet (140 m on your left).




After another 70 m cross the ford.



After another 100 m **veer right**.



After another 60 m veer left.



After another 520 m **veer right**.



After another 200 m come to the end.
